

Rayleigh - Ritz:

$\tilde{u} = Q y$ approximate eigenvector

$$(A - \mu I) \tilde{u} \perp X \rightarrow Q^H (A - \mu I) \tilde{u} = 0 \rightarrow Q^H (A - \mu I) Q y = 0$$

$$\rightarrow Q^H A Q y = \mu y$$

mxm eigenvalue problem

Projection method: case of invariant subspaces:

By definition:

X invariant if $A X \subseteq X$

Assume X invariant and let Q = orthonormal basis of X

μ, \tilde{u} approximate eigenpair obtained from proj. method.

$$\mathbb{R}^n = X \oplus X^\perp$$

Then:

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$$(A - \mu I) \tilde{u} = \begin{matrix} A \tilde{u} \\ \in X \end{matrix} - \mu \tilde{u} \in X \rightarrow (A - \mu I) \tilde{u} = Q z$$

But recall that $Q^H (A - \mu I) \tilde{u} = 0 \rightarrow Q^H Q z = z = 0 \rightarrow$

$(A - \mu I) \tilde{u} = 0 \rightarrow \mu, \tilde{u}$ exact eigenpair \square

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$$w := A v_j$$

$$w := A v_j - \sum_{i=1}^j h_{i,j} v_i \rightarrow A v_j = \sum_{i=1}^{j+1} h_{i,j} v_i$$

$$h_{j+1,j} = \|w\|$$

$$v_{j+1} = w / h_{j+1,j}$$

$$A V_m = V_{m+1} \tilde{H}_m$$

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
